# Trinity Tidings ~ October 2023



"Jesus said, Someone gave a great dinner and invited many...but they all alike began to make excuses...Then the master said [in anger], Go out at once...and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame...when there was more room, the master said, Go out into the roads and lanes, and compel people to come in, so that my house may be filled!" (Luke 14:16-23 paraphrased).

A banquet prepared for friends and friends in high places was an epic fail. After hearing multiple lame excuses, the infuriated man opened his house to anyone who would come. I believe this is what Jesus experiences when His people make excuses Sunday morning. God wants His house to be filled so that we can be made whole again, born anew in Him. His unconditional love, His compassion, His willingness to die for us are the reasons answer the invitation to sit at the Lord's Table. "That sin and shame that you brought with you, you can leave it at the door, and let mercy draw you near," are lyrics from, "Come to the Table" and sung by Sidewalk Prophets. We leave at the table what we no longer need to carry within.

The song "Come to the Table," was inspired by the movie, "Hook," more specifically the line, "motley crew of misfits." In the "scene where Peter Pan and Rufio and everybody is throwing food at each other," reminded them of themselves. Self-described ruffians, the members of Sidewalk Prophets claim that these are the kind of "people that God calls," the lost children of God and we need to come back home. Everybody is invited!" The poor, crippled, blind, and lame are just as much metaphors as corporeal. Our spirits need the richness only Jesus can give. We reach a deficit if we stray too far, and our shortsightedness prevents us from the One who can heal all things. God wants His house filled!

The dinner table scenario described above twice warms my heart. Partly because our family gathered around a long table in the dining room for noon dinner every Saturday and so the "Hook" image reminds me of food fights my siblings and I had, even long after we reached adulthood. It was a silly dare which sometimes turned into a little food on the face or clothing. Our table was always a table of love, a welcoming one where life was measured, and distractions were few. Today, abundant opportunities vie for the attention of kids and adults alike making it difficult for even one meal be shared each week where the entire family is present. Also, the table represents continuity and a safe place where, we can reconnect weekly, here at church with one another and with God. Jesus asks us to 'Come to the Table' where "Love opened the door for us. [we are invited to] Take our place beside the Savior, sit down and be set free. There's no one unwelcome here." Come and dine, be present at the Lord's Table, and continually be refueled, reenergized and renewed through the body and blood of Jesus Christ. Because God wants His house to be filled...at church, at home and wherever there are two or three gathered in His name. Come Lord Jesus, be our guest, let these gifts to us be blest. Amen!

# **Reformation Sunday – October 29**

Martin Luther said that the Bible and the teachings of Jesus can all be understood by three solas. *The three Lutheran SOLAS* (sola, Latin from alone) are core principles of the Reformation that guide Lutheran Theology to this day.

If you understand these three solas, you will be able to wonderfully explain what the Reformation was all about and what is the heart of the Bible as we understand it even today.





We are saved by God's grace alone and not by doing good works, believing the right things or behaving in a certain way. Indeed, we are not even able to participate in our salvation, because humans are and will always be sinful, part of the human condition we cannot escape. We completely rely on God in Christ to be graceful and save us even though we do not deserve it.

God's unconditional love for us is the reason for God's free gift of grace. Grace frees the Christian from all worries about salvation. It frees us up to do God's work with our hands in this world. We are called to pour the love we receive from God back into the world again and to become Agents of God's grace.







Faith comes from God through the Holy Spirit as you participate in the life of the church. Sometimes, you feel Christ's presence within your soul and life, and that is always a great blessing. Sometimes you feel nothing. Sometimes your faith is passionate and fervent. At other times you are full of doubts. Independent of what you feel and think, Christ is always with you, and his promise of forgiveness and salvation is for you.

Lutherans follow a man, Jesus Christ, not a book. The Holy Scriptures testify to the Word of God becoming flesh in Jesus Christ. The authority of the Lutheran church is rooted in the testimony of scripture. The Lutheran church reads that testimony through the eyes of the gospel, which is the good news of Jesus Christ who defeated death and bridged the gap between humans and God.
